### **Introducing the new Rescue 65** The Newest Addition to the McKenzie **Clearwater Fire Department Fleet**

Thanks to generous community donations and fundraising, the McKenzie Clearwater Fire Department (MCFD) now proudly owns a new Ford 550 Rescue Truck, designated Rescue 65. It is equipped with Jaws of Life, medical rescue equipment, winches, supply bars, and more.

The previous Rescue 65, a 1995 GMC 3500 diesel truck donated by Rick Suche in 2015, had become unreliable with electrical issues, rust, and space limitations. As MCFD's responsibilities grew beyond basic auto extrication to

include ambulance assists, heavy auto rescue, and ice water rescue, the old truck could no longer carry all necessary equipment. MCFD also needed a vehicle capable of towing its fireboat, Pumper 62, and its snowmobile, Rescue 63.

Initially, the Board considered replacing only the chassis, but the 30-year-old body's deficiencies made a new truck the better choice. Purchasing a stock unit from Fort Garry Fire Trucks reduced delivery time to six months instead of two years.



Slide-out drawers provide easy access, and 12v power outlets support battery-operated tools. The truck's 360-degree scene lighting enhances safety at emergency sites.

Firefighter Bree Haney praised the truck's functionality, saying, "We each organized a section. I arranged the medical equipment from minor to major injuries. We have full sections for auto extrication, ice water rescue, backboards, and rescue sleds. The truck was an amazing purchase!"

#### FIREFIGHTER PROFILE **Coral Johnson**

A passion for helping others and being first on the scene led Coral Johnson to volunteer with McKenzie-Clearwater Fire Department (MCFD) in 2021. She joined without knowing anyone and now considers her 21 fellow firefighters a second family.

Beyond ongoing MCFD training, Coral's schooling and work experience give her confidence at rescue scenes. After high school in Winnipeg, she worked ambulance shifts for a stretcher service handling non-emergency patient transfers. Five years ago, she moved to Clearwater Bay, completed a year of paramedic school through Seven Gens, and now works occasional shifts as an Ambulance Communication Officer for Lake of the Woods District Hospital. Her full-time job is in Patient Services for the Sunset Country Family Health Team. With MVCs and medical calls making up most of MCFD's responses, her medical background has been invaluable.

#### Coral, 26, is one of three female firefighters on the team. She finds MCFD welcoming and has "made so many friends and connections."

Last summer, she was dispatching a fire call for a burning boathouse, then 15 minutes later, off duty, she joined the MCFD team on scene. The boathouse was connected to a cabin by a staircase, which firefighters chainsawed in half to stop the fire from spreading. After hours of work, they saved the cabin.

Coral has long been passionate about community. In grade eight, she started a hockey tournament that ran six years and raised \$120,000 for children's charities. She also applauds MCFD's participation in Heroes Week at Zig Zag Yacht Club, where kids interact with firefighters and equipment, possibly inspiring future careers.

Outside of firefighting, Coral enjoys boating, fishing, swimming, and relaxing on the dock. A lifelong dog lover, she goes everywhere with Scout, her rescued companion of three years. Her motto: "Be there on someone's worst day to make it a little bit better!"

# 8 Years of Gratitude and Counting

For 45 years Penny and I drove by the Clearwater Fire Hall and hoped we'd never be in a major accident, or have a cottage fire and need MCFD's support. Our support for MCFD though was spotty. Just not top-of-mind.

Then, eight years ago, Penny fell down our cottage steps, cracked her head several times on the way down, and, as the doctor put it, turned her left wrist into a smashed eggshell plus a major nasty to her left ankle.

I heard the tumble, found her, and as she came round, she wasn't able to move. I called an ambulance for help.

First on the scene was the MCFD. With expertise, compassion and gentle skill they saw her loaded onto a stretcher and into an ambulance. As quickly as they arrived, they were gone—truck to the firehall and themselves, no doubt, back to family and dinner. We don't know who they were but we do know the difference they made and we remain deeply grateful to them. They were amazing.

You may never need MCFD yourself, but they respond to more than 100 emergencies every year. Chances are someone you care for will need them. Since Penny's tumble we've been grateful annual donors. I hope you will join us supporting MCFD's volunteers saving lives, making a difference.
